



WASTE GUIDE



As of 1 March 2022, we will collect your residual waste once every 4 weeks. We will help you separate your waste correctly. See which waste goes where.



In doubt? Check the waste guide of the 'Afvalkalender Venray' app. Here you can also see where you can dispose of electrical machines and minor chemical waste.



PMD-waste

in the special PMD bag



Plastic, metal and cardboard fibres are obtained from PMD as raw material for new products.

All plastic or metal packaging and drink cartons. No need to clean, but it needs to be empty!

Veelvoorkomend PMD-afval:

- Empty plastic bottles and containers of soda, sauce and washing liquid
- Empty cups, beakers and containers used for fries, yoghurt or butter
- Empty tubes, containers and lids of, for example, toothpaste
- Empty food cans, cans for beverages, beer, soup or pet food
- Aluminium plates and containers
- Empty drink cartons (for example milk, fruit juice, water) and small cartons

This does not belong in the PMD waste:

- Polystyrene
- Toys
- Diapers



Take along your own cup or water bottle when you go out.



Green waste

in the green container



Green waste is turned into compost and biogas.

Green waste refers to vegetable, fruit, garden and food waste. Is separating food waste dirty? Use the biodegradable bags.

Common green waste:

- Vegetable and fruit waste and peels
- Food waste (including bones)
- Bread, dough, rice and pasta
- Tea and coffee dregs
- Hay, straw, sawdust used for pets
- Flowers, house plants and garden

This does not belong in the green waste:

- Packaging (including bioplastics)
- Teabags, coffee pads and cups
- Cat litter and dog poo
- Tobacco, butts and ash



Smell or taste whether food is still good, even after the best before date.



Diapers

in the diaper container



Diapers are turned into plastic and biogas.

Only place baby and incontinence diapers in the special diaper bag.

This does not belong in the diaper container:

- (Latex) gloves
- Packaging of medicines or cream
- Pads
- Stoma material



Try using modern washable diapers.



Glass

in the glass



Glass is melted into new glass.

Glass pots, bottles and packaging (including lids). No need to clean, but it needs to be empty!

This does not belong in the glass container:

- Drink glasses
- Vases
- Oven and microwave plates
- Mirrors and windows

Textile

in the textile



Textile fibres are reused for new textile products.

Dry, clean textile in a closed bag.

Common textile waste:

- Clothing and cloths/towels
- Shoes (tied together)
- Cuddly toys
- Belts and caps
- Duvet covers and sheets
- Curtains

This does not belong in the textile container:

- Dirty clothing (e.g. Oil and paint stains)
- Cushions and duvets
- Carpeting



Purchase or swap clothing via the internet or a thrift store.



Paper/cardboard

in boxes or bundled



Paper is reused for up to 7 times.

Clean, dry paper or carton.

Common paper waste:

- Paper and leaflets
- Cardboard boxes
- Clean pizza boxes
- Envelopes

This does not belong in the paper waste:

- Wet or dirty paper
- Drink cartons
- Bubble envelopes
- Lunch bag containing plastic

Residual waste

in the grey container

Residual waste is burnt and not re-used.

The left-over waste, after having sorted your waste.

Common residual waste:

- Bags/containers with aluminium on the inside
- Aluminium foil
- Women's sanitary pads and hygienic paper
- Polystyrene
- Wet or dirty paper and cardboard
- Tea bags
- Blister strips of medicine



Take usable old items to the thrift store.



Download the app!

In future, we will increasingly communicate via the Afvalkalender app. Download the 'Afvalkalender Venray' app. This way you are always informed of any changes. You will also receive tips in the app on how to separate waste.



Bulk waste

You take the bulk waste to the waste recycling point. Make sure you sort your waste beforehand. This ensures that the waste is still usable (iron, wood, polystyrene etc.) and prevents long waiting times.
